Savour the stunning scenery of South and West Wales with a day spent in the Pembrokeshire National Park and visits to two of the region's renowned gardens.

Tour Itinerary

Day 1 Travel to Swansea with a recommended stop in the delightful town of Ledbury.

Day 2 Full day excursion to the spectacular Pembrokeshire Coast. We recommend a stop in the beautiful seaside town of Tenby and a visit to St. Davids, the UK's smallest city, with its craft shops and art galleries.

Day 3 Discover the National Botanic Garden of Wales. Nestled in the Tywi Valley the garden combines themed displays, rolling parkland and secluded woodland. The award winning Great Glasshouse is a highlight of any visit with its profusion of rare, fragrant, exotic and even spooky plants. Enjoy some free time in Carmarthen, before returning to the hotel.

Day 4 Take a scenic drive across the Brecon Beacons with a stop in the market town of Brecon. This afternoon visit Aberglasney Gardens. Abandoned for 50 years, with the house and garden overgrown and crumbling, the restoration of Aberglasney has been a remarkable achievement. Explore the ancient formal gardens with its pools, parapets and cloisters and then the surrounding gardens, which are now a renowned plantsman's paradise. A visit to Dinefwr Park and Castle in nearby Llandeilo can also be included for an extra charge.

Day 5 Homeward journey with a stop in Cardiff if time permits.
